Thesis: *A Body of One’s Own: An Institutional Approach to Property and Self-Ownership*
Summary: My thesis examined the appeal behind the concept of self-ownership to provide an alternative theory of the link between autonomy and property rights. I developed an institutional approach which allows us to identify reasons internal to a general justification of property rights that limit the extent of ownership powers over different kinds of object (including parts of one’s body). This explains why some aspects of ourselves are inalienable, others are potentially alienable, and external objects are straightforwardly alienable.
